The **European Internet Forum** is established as a non-profit association founded in 2000 by Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) from different political groups, with the aim to create an MEP-led network of digital policy stakeholders and a neutral and transparent platform to better understand the Internet and its foreseeable impact on Europe's economy, society and governance.



Mission

We support European political leadership for the development of European and multilateral public policies responsive to the political, economic and social challenges of worldwide digital transformation.

We focus on digital policy issues at the top of Europe's agenda and on emerging future trends at both European and global levels. Through a continuous programme of **live debates** and **special projects** bringing together stakeholders and featuring open and inclusive dialogue, our Forum helps create a space for greater understanding of and engagement in Europe's digital future. EIF does not itself take any position nor represent specific interests.

Our multi-stakeholder Forum comprises **Political members (MEPs)**, as well as **Business members** and **Associate members**, which together encompass a broad range of interests and actors in the vanguard of European and global digital transformation. All members have the opportunity to actively participate in our activities and to help shape our programme and event agendas.







Activities



Over the course of the year, EIF delivered a rich programme of in-person activities. In total, 20 MEP-led digital policy debates were organised, addressing key issues on the EU digital agenda, including artificial intelligence, connectivity, cybersecurity, data, digital infrastructure, internet governance and the digital economy. EIF also ensured effective internal governance through one General Assembly meeting, two online Programming Committee meetings, four Steering Committee meetings and three “Virtual coffee with the Team” meetings.

2025 also marked EIF’s 25th anniversary. Dedicated celebratory and communication initiatives were integrated into the Forum’s regular programme, creating opportunities to reflect on EIF’s role over the past 25 years and its continued contribution to digital policy dialogue. These activities are presented in more detail in the following sections of this report.



EIF’s 2025 programme further included thematic roundtables and exchanges held in collaboration with partners, notably with TPN during Transatlantic Week, as well as with GSMA in the context of MWC Barcelona. The year also saw the first stage of an MEP Visit to Top Tech Sites in Belgium, including a visit to imec, providing policymakers with direct exposure to Europe’s research and innovation ecosystem.

Building on its launch in late 2024, EIF continued and expanded its Tech Masterclasses initiative in 2025. A total of five masterclasses were organised for European Parliament staff, offering neutral and accessible explanations of key technologies.

EIF 25th Anniversary

In October 2025, EIF marked its 25th anniversary with a celebratory reception in the Presidential Salon of the European Parliament in Brussels. The event brought together current and former Members of the European Parliament, representatives from the European Commission, industry stakeholders and long-standing partners of EIF to acknowledge a quarter century of sustained dialogue on digital policy.



Speakers reflected on EIF's founding vision and its role in facilitating constructive discussion across political, institutional and stakeholder boundaries. The reception honoured EIF's co-founders and successive leaders, whose work over the past 25 years helped establish the Forum as a trusted space for exchange and deliberation on Europe's evolving digital landscape.

In his keynote address, Roberto Viola, Director-General of DG CNECT at the European Commission, emphasised how the Forum anticipated many of the strategic questions facing Europe today and underlined the importance of continued engagement with emerging technologies.

The anniversary reception was a milestone in EIF's calendar, building institutional continuity and recognising the work of many Members, partners and contributors who have shaped the Forum's development since its creation in 2000.

25 years at a glance

☀ 2000

EIF is established as a MEP-led, non-partisan forum to facilitate dialogue between the European Parliament and stakeholders on internet and digital policy.

☀ 2000–2010s

EIF supports structured exchanges on the development of the internet and the digital economy, providing a neutral space for discussion between policymakers, industry and experts.

☀ 2010s–2024

As digital policy expands, EIF broadens its scope to cover data protection, cybersecurity, connectivity, digital infrastructure and emerging technologies, while organising hundreds of MEP-led debates and study visits, including hands-on visits to digital and technology sites in Europe and beyond.

☀ 2025

EIF marks its 25th anniversary, bringing together Members of the European Parliament, institutional representatives and partners to reflect on a quarter century of dialogue and institutional continuity.

Their remarks highlighted the value of foresight, dialogue and cross-party cooperation in shaping EIF's work over time. In recognition of their longstanding commitment and leadership, each received an award acknowledging their contribution to the Forum's development over the past 25 years.



EIF has long served as a platform connecting institutions, policymakers and stakeholders around Europe's digital agenda. By bringing together Members of the European Parliament, representatives of EU institutions and a broad range of digital policy actors, the Forum supports informed dialogue and mutual understanding across institutional and sectoral boundaries.

The story

Following EIF's 25th anniversary, we took the opportunity to produce a short documentary film tracing EIF's origins in 2000 and its evolution into a neutral platform for dialogue, where policymakers, industry, academia and civil society come together to learn, question and shape Europe's digital future.



MEP visits



MWC25 Barcelona

MWC Barcelona is the world's largest event focused on mobile connectivity and digital technologies. In 2025, EIF organised a visit bringing together 12 MEPs and parliamentary assistants, with hands-on exchanges and guided visits to selected exhibition stands, offering direct insight into emerging technologies shaping Europe's digital ecosystem.

Transatlantic Week by TPN

Transatlantic Week 2025 by Transatlantic Policy Network (TPN) made one thing clear: the EU-US partnership is essential to building a trusted and resilient tech future, to ensure stability and a world order that is based on the rule of law. We were in Washington DC to support our members and contribute to this timely exchange under the theme "EU-US Partnership: Priorities for Joint Action Towards 2030."



MEP visit to Top Tech Sites in Belgium

As the first stage of this visit, the stop at imec in Leuven provided insight into the world's largest semiconductor R&D cleanroom. The visit brought together MEPs, advisors and parliamentary assistants for hands-on learning and exchange. The second stage is planned for early 2026, with visits to the Digital Realty data centre and NOKIA.

Tech Masterclasses

Below, you will find details about the Tech Masterclasses organised in 2025, following the two first sessions held in 2024. These Masterclasses are designed exclusively for European Parliament staff and parliamentary assistants. In 2026, EIF will organise three additional Masterclasses.

EIF does not take positions on policy issues and expert presentations do not reflect EIF's views.



Participants discovered the workings of **Cloud technology** and the reasons for using remote servers for data management, storage, and processing instead of local servers or personal computers. They gained insights into how cloud computing facilitates scalable, on-demand access to resources and services, while exploring its applications in data storage, processing, and software deployment.

The session introduced the foundations of **artificial intelligence**, from machine learning and neural networks to how models learn from data. They also looked at practical applications such as natural language processing and computer vision, building a clearer understanding of how AI is developed and used in real-world services.



Participants examined the principles of **quantum** mechanics that underpin quantum computing and how these differ from classical approaches. The session highlighted how quantum algorithms can address problems beyond the reach of classical computers, with potential applications in areas such as cryptography, drug discovery, and climate modelling.

This session focused on how digital assets can be protected in an increasingly interconnected environment. The discussion covered key areas such as network security, encryption, risk management, and incident response, while also exploring the respective roles of public and private actors in addressing evolving **cybersecurity** threats.



Participants explored the core principles of **blockchain** technology, including decentralised ledgers, cryptographic security, and consensus mechanisms. The session examined how blockchain is applied across sectors such as finance and supply chains, with practical examples including cryptocurrencies and smart contracts.





Governance



Our governing and operating bodies include our Steering Committee (SC) and Governing Board as well as our Programming Committee (PC), ad-hoc event Organising Committees (OC), and our General Assembly (GA).

Our programme of activities is regularly discussed at **Programming Committee** meetings, which are open to all members, and then reviewed for approval at **Steering Committee** meetings.



The **Programming Committee** (PC) is co-chaired by an MEP and by a Business and/or Associate member from the Steering Committee. In 2024, it was co-chaired by Axel Voss MEP and Steering Committee Vice-Chair, and by Board member Aurélie Doutriaux. Members can freely suggest or support activities at any time by contacting our Secretariat. All our activities are led by an MEP.



The **Steering Committee** (SC) is the major driving force behind our Forum. It sets the strategy, approves the programme of activities based on our membership's input, decides on new members and makes recommendations to the Board. Chaired by an MEP, it includes up to 15 Political members (MEPs), 1 external personality and all Board members.



Currently chaired by Audrey Scozzarro-Ferrazzini (Qualcomm), our Governing Board manages administrative matters and financial and human resources. It includes up to 8 representatives from our Business Membership and up to 6 representatives from our Associate Membership, who are elected by the General Assembly with a 3-year mandate. Board members are also *ex officio* members of the Steering Committee.



The agenda of each event is shaped by members who volunteer to work together in an **Organising Committee (OC)**, an ad-hoc taskforce led by the MEP chairing the event and coordinated by a member from the Business or Associate membership. Members can join OCs for scheduled events at any time via their Member Area.



As in all non-profit associations, we also hold a **General Assembly (GA)** meeting at least once a year, where all members gather to review past and future activities, approve budget and financial accounts, and any other business.

Governance

Steering Committee

In 2025, the Forum's governance evolved with updates to both the Steering Committee and the Governing Board. MEP Lina Gálvez, MEP Birgit Sippel and MEP Michał Kobosko joined the Steering Committee. Eduardo Lanza was appointed at the General Assembly in June.
