# Online payments and e-Signatures

This EIF breakfast debate aims to look both at the barriers and at the innovative and regulatory solutions that can help the development of online payments and e-signatures across the EU.

Figures in the European Commission's Digital Agenda (DAE) Scoreboard published in June highlight that Europeans have access to basic digital networks and services, but we are missing out on exploiting the huge benefits of the digital revolution, including online and m-payments and e-signatures. Barriers include the lack of a comprehensive EU cross-border and cross-sector framework for secure, trustworthy and easy-to-use electronic transactions that encompasses electronic identification and trust services.

During our debate we will discuss the latest from the industry, to better understand technological and market developments. We will also discuss the interplay with EU regulatory and policy developments.
